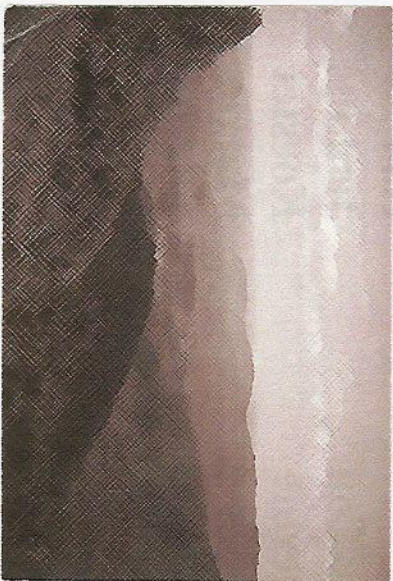

Nestled in the beautiful Smoky Mountains, **Western Carolina University** provides a lovely location for Mountain Collegium. Comfortable accommodations and classrooms are all in an air-conditioned, non-smoking dorm with free high-speed internet. Double occupancy rooms have private bath; single occupancy share a bath. Most meals will be in the new campus cafeteria (a few will be catered).

Mountain Collegium, an informal yet intensive workshop, offers study of Medieval, Renaissance, and Baroque music, focusing on recorder, viol, other early instruments, and voice. Featured classes include technique, improvisation, and a variety of consorts and repertoire. Students may also choose classes in folk, Appalachian, Celtic, Sephardic, and contemporary music. Small classes and easy access to faculty create a friendly and relaxed learning experience.

Four periods in the day provide a variety of options for recorder and viol players. Loud band, singing, and opportunities to study baroque flute, pennywhistle, mountain dulcimer, hurdy-gurdy, and harp give students an eclectic musical experience that brings them back year after year. Free time allows for informal music making; evenings include group playing and English country dancing with a live (and lively!) band. An inspiring faculty concert and informal student "show and tell" recital top off the week. Won't you become a part of the Mountain Collegium family this year?

The workshop begins with registration on Sunday afternoon, June 27. After our catered dinner, an evening orientation leads to a large playing session, followed by an ice cream social. Classes begin on Monday morning and run through Friday afternoon. Checkout is on Saturday after breakfast.
